Teacher wise workload is allotted for the academic year accordingly they prepare their teaching plans for respective subjects. The lecture plans are written in their individual Academic Diary. Teachers are expected to execute their course deliverables according to teaching plan. Teachers refer to the standard reference books prescribed by University along with other sources of information available through online and offline for effective delivery of curriculum. Besides the use of conventional methods, various other teaching methods like Quiz, Group Discussion, Demonstrations, Debates, PPT

Presentations, Allied Projects, Games, Short Films, Industrial Visits, Add-on practicals, Open book tests, Assignments, Videos, Use of charts and graphs, Case studies are used for effective curriculum delivery. Based on semester wise result analysis of every course corrective measures are suggested by IQAC and bridge courses and remedial lectures are conducted if required. Academic review and feedback is taken periodically. The review is taken by conducting regular meetings about difficulties faced by teachers while teaching.
